Registration:

All registrants must complete (in full) the enrollment form included within this schedule and mail or fax it back to OU's Greater Kansas City campus at 4370 West 109th Street, Suite 200; Overland Park, KS 66211. Enrollments will be accepted immediately with FULL PAYMENT.

Enrollment form must be submitted two-weeks prior to course start in order to guarantee placement. Class size is limited and enrollments are accepted on a first-received basis. A Student Data Sheet (SDS) form will be sent to confirm enrollment.

Application Fee:

A one-time, non-refundable fee of \$15 is to be paid by all NEW OU students.

Tuition:

The cost of tuition for classroom instruction is \$125 per graduate semester credit hour, online tuition is \$145 per graduate semester credit hour. Payment forms accepted: check, American Express, Visa, Mastercard, or Discover.

Transcripts:

Official transcripts will be mailed directly to the student's address approximately three weeks after the ending date of your course.

Refund/Course Exchange:

A \$50.00 drop fee is assessed for any cancelled or changed enrollments within the two weeks prior to the start date of class. Enrollments cancelled or changed prior to two weeks before the start date will receive a full refund.
