Programs and Services Offered

- ❑ Ottawa University offers Bachelor degrees. Students can choose from 21 undergraduate majors: Bachelor of Arts in Accounting, Business Administration, Business Economics, Communication, Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, English, Health Care Management, History, Human Resources, Human Services, Law Enforcement, Management, Management of Information Systems, Marketing, Mathematics, Psychology, Public Administration, Studies in Christian Ministries, Studies in Liberal Arts, and Bachelor of Science in Nursing- RN to BSN.
- ❑ Ottawa University offers Masters Degrees. Students can choose from 4 graduate programs: Master of Arts in Human Resources, Master of Arts in Education, Master of Arts in Counseling, and Master of Business Administration.
- ❑ All undergraduate and graduate programs listed above are available completely online.
- ❑ Double majors, minors, and concentrations are available to maximize student marketability.
- ❑ Each student is assigned a Student Success Team of three advisors: An Enrollment Advisor to assist the student through the streamlined enrollment process, a Finance Advisor to provide discuss financial options available, and an Academic advisor who will work with the student to create a personalized degree completion plan.
- ❑ Financial aid is available to those who qualify and Finance Advisors are available to assist with financial options.
- ❑ Students may transfer up to 80 lower division credits towards a bachelor's degree.

Course Format

- ❑ *No group work!* Ottawa University respects the busy schedules of working professionals.
- ❑ *No set log in times.* While there are two assignment deadlines per week, there are no set log in times so students are able to complete coursework on their schedule.
- ❑ *Not a cohort program!* Students may take one or more courses per term. Students also have the option to take terms off during the year and may re-enter at any time. New students can start during any of the six, eight-week terms offered per year.
- ❑ Majority of Undergraduate courses are four semester credits per course.
- ❑ *Ottawa University is committed to helping students graduate on time!* Experienced staff members develop a long-term course schedule so classes are available when students need them.
