

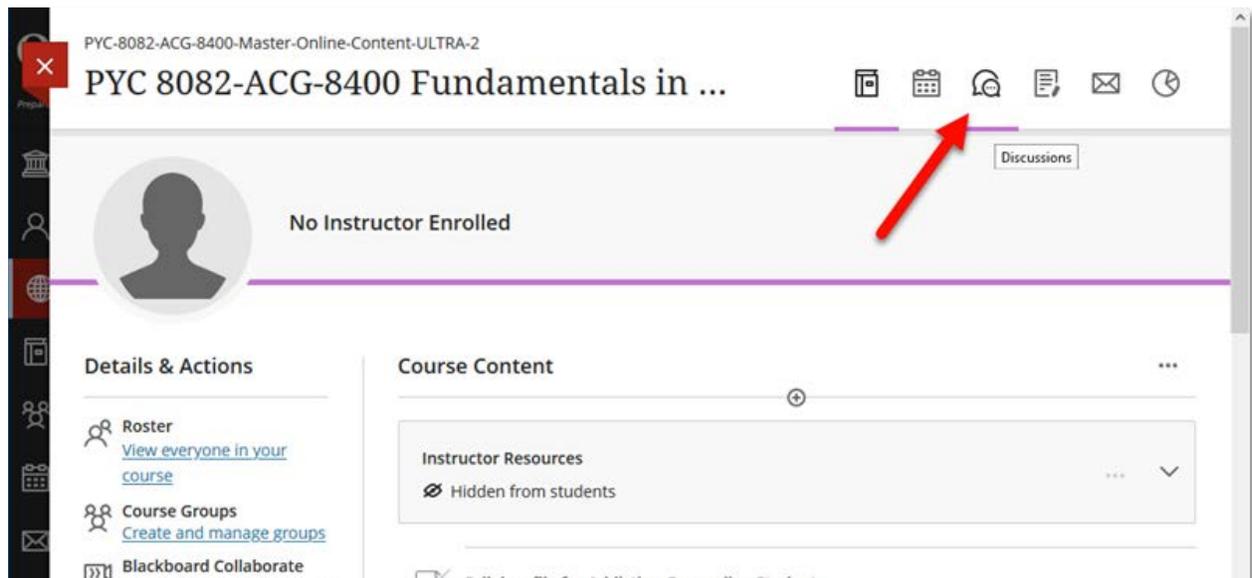
Adjusting Discussion Prompts in the New Blackboard Experience

Terms to know:

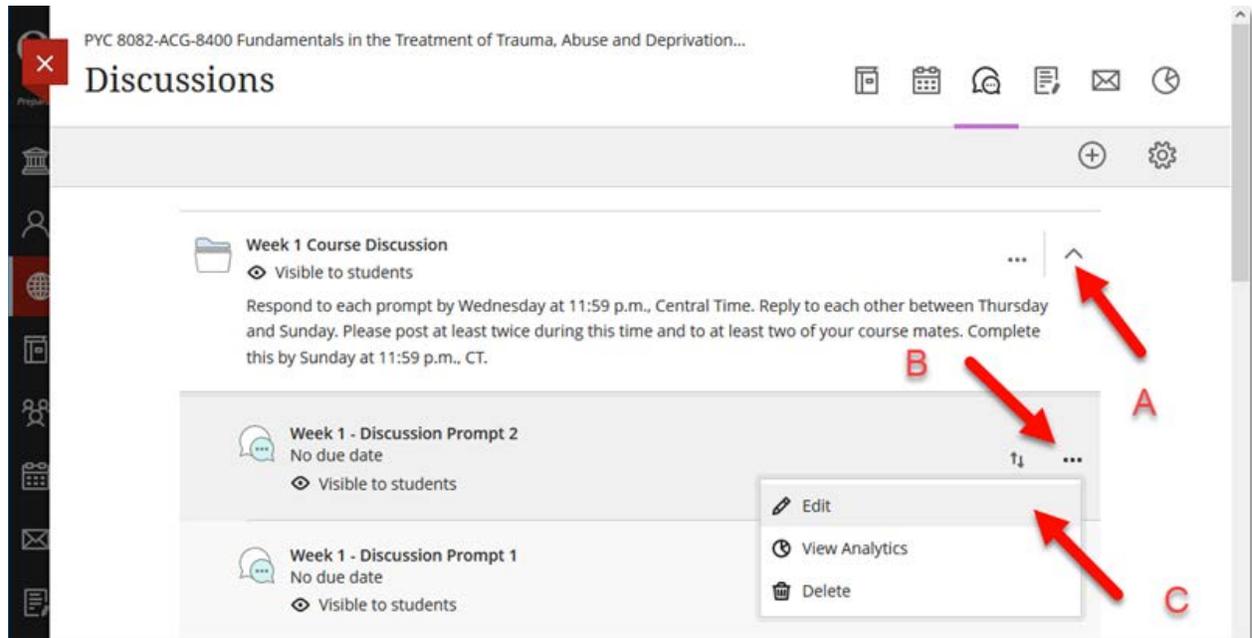
- **Forum or Board:** An area where topics are discussed.
- **Thread:** Within a forum, a list of posts is called a thread. Students respond to a prompt that is posted in a thread.
- **Prompt:** The question that is posted in a thread.

Workflow:

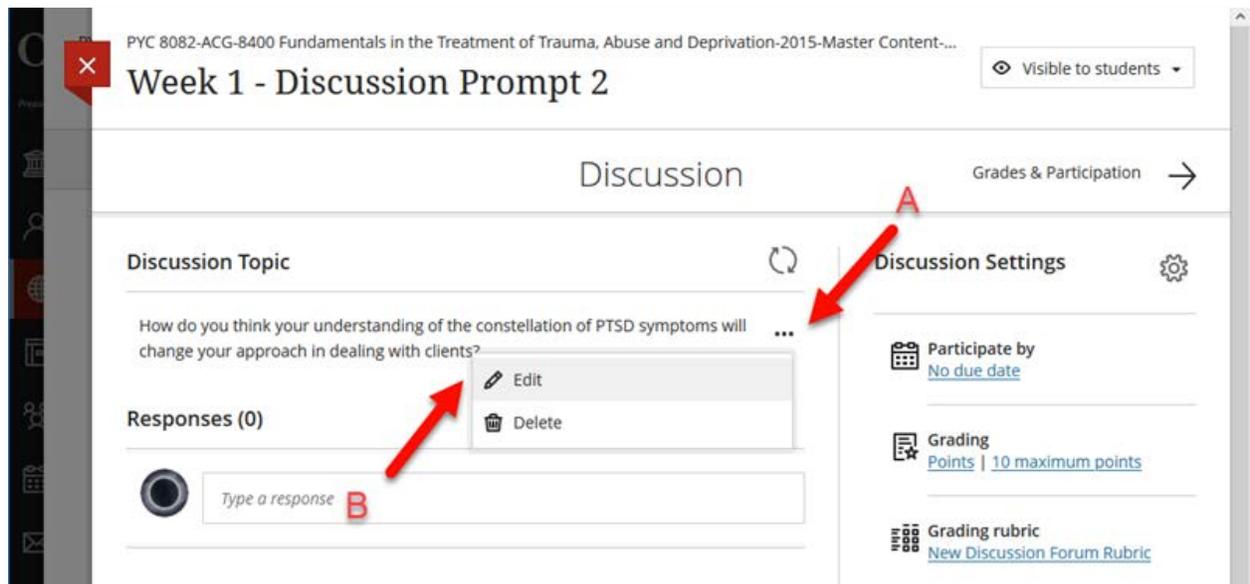
1. Click on the Discussion Board icon in the top right set of tabs from within your Blackboard course.



2. Click on the chevron for the appropriate discussion week, then click the ellipsis, then Edit.



3. Click on the ellipsis next to the prompt text, then Edit.



4. Make the needed changes to the discussion prompt, then click Save.
