Are there areas in your life that have difficulties that could be drawn upon in your career

to help others? Have you overcome these difficulties? How?

How will you personally contribute to Ottawa University's Learning Community?

Optional Essay Question #3 (200-500 words):

Encouraged if you have less than 3.0 undergraduate GPA.

Is there any further information that you wish to provide the admissions committee? If so, provide an explanation of any areas of concern in your academic record or your personal history.

Third paragraph (*Optional*) – Self-awareness is important to being successful. It is important to be able to reflect on yourself. Identify any areas of concern. These could be difficulties, shortcoming or areas of improvement. If your grades in your undergraduate degree were not great, why? It is ok to say that you did not know what you wanted to do.
