WIRELESS

Ottawa University residence halls are wireless! The University will use either coax and/or HDMI for TV. Any questions call 785-248-2313!

Important Note: NO ONE will be allowed to check into the residence halls until the enrollment confirmation process has been completed. Parents will NOT be allowed to check in for you!

YOU'VE GOT MAIL

This fall you will find your personal mailbox located on the lower level of the Gangwish Library. The mail room ensures that all mail (letters and packages) is distributed by noon daily, and allows you to retrieve your mail at any time during the building's hours of operation. A key will be issued to access your mailbox. Go to the Braves Fan Shop to pick up your mailbox key upon your arrival on campus.

Package Delivery — You will receive an email notification for pick-up location and instructions. Some parcels will be placed in larger package mailboxes and a key will be placed in your personal mailbox. When retrieving your package, the corresponding key will remain in the door.

APPLIANCE POLICY

Only cooking appliances with self-contained heating units may be used in student rooms. Such appliances include automatic-shut off coffee makers, hot air popcorn poppers, microwave ovens (no more than 900 watts), etc. Appliances with an exposed element or that use oil are not permitted with the exception of a toaster. Only small appliances are allowed in residence halls. Full-size or apartment-sized refrigerators, freezers, or similar items are prohibited. Refrigerators should not exceed 5.0 cubic feet.

REFRIGERATOR DIMENSIONS:

These dimensions meet the requirements for students wanting to house their refrigerators in the space provided in the kitchenette. Maximum Height: 33.5" Maximum Width: 19" Maximum Depth: 24"

DISCOVER WHAT IS NEW

What do you use your Braves Card for?

Your Braves Card is your student ID, meal card, access into your residence hall, payment at vending machines throughout campus, copies and prints in the Copy Center and computer labs, purchases in the Braves Fan Shop, Dining Dollars or Braves Cash in the Gibson Student Center, as well as the laundry facilities within your residence hall. The best part—you and your parent(s) both can add money onto your card at www.ottawa.edu/bravescard.

Where all can I use my card?

As you walk around campus, you will see signs for where you can use your Braves Card to make purchases across campus.

Be looking for signs, like the one shown here, for where to use your Braves Card.

What are Dining Dollars?

These are funds (in correlation with the 50-block, 100-block, 225-block and All-Access meal plans) that are automatically

loaded on your Braves Card for use in the Gibson Student Center, Hetrick Bistro. Any unused funds are eliminated at the end of the academic semester.

What is Braves Cash?

This is the most flexible account on your Braves Card. These funds can be used throughout campus for print, copy, vending and laundry services, as well as in the Hetrick Bistro. Additional funds can easily be added to this account on your Braves Card in a variety of ways.



First is through the ADM in the Pelton Lounge of Gangwish Library.

Second, you may add funds online with no fees. Online transactions are performed at www.ottawa.edu/bravescard. You also have the ability to automatically reload your funds when your balance drops below a specific amount, or on a particular day of the week or month.

Third, your parents can go online and add funds through the same site. Your parents will need your student ID number and your birth date in order to add funds to your account.

GET STARTED ON THE RIGHT TRACK

Full participation in orientation activities lead you to: 1) meet MANY new friends, 2) greater success as you'll know what services are available, and 3) get good grades. Did we say grades? Yes, we did.

Participation in orientation is a requirement and part of the grade you will receive for your core class. It's important that you fully engage in this process as it will affect your ability to represent OU in organizations and athletics. We want you to be successful and our research indicates that students who attend all sessions have better grades, will generally graduate in four years, and have more positive friendships.

ALCOHOL-WISE

More than 40 percent of college students nationwide claim to engage in drinking games and binge drinking. Drinking can have a negative effect on your academic and/or your athletic performance. While some students notice no different initially, it can, over time, impact your grades and your skills. In an effort to give incoming students the facts about alcohol, Ottawa University requires all first-year students to take Alcohol-Wise, an online alcohol prevention program. Whether you drink or not, Alcohol-Wise will empower you to make well-informed decisions and will help you cope with the drinking behavior of peers. **This course must be completed prior to arrival and/or move in on campus.**

CONSENT AND RESPECT

With data from the National Institute of Justice showing one in five college women and one in sixteen men will experience some form of non-consensual sexual activity by graduation, the widespread impact of sexual violence on students presents an urgent and pressing challenge for our nation's campuses. In an effort to give incoming students the facts, Ottawa University requires all incoming students to take Consent and Respect, an online prevention course. **This course must be completed prior to arrival and/or move in on campus.**

WANT MONEY?

All new students attend a presentation during Orientation regarding student employment. Students interested in work study should check with the Office of Financial Aid to determine their eligibility. You may do this prior to arriving on campus.

Students must complete all required forms prior to working on campus. These include the I-9 (Employment Eligibility Verification), W-4 form, and K-4 withholding forms and the direct deposit authorization. You must have identification documents (not copies) with you. You may review the list of acceptable documents on the MyOttawa web portal. Click 'Work Study Resources' and the I-9 link. The information is on page three. Note that a document from Column A is sufficient; otherwise you must provide a document from both Column B and Column C. Be sure to bring your bank account information if you intend to use Direct Deposit, including routing/transit and account number.

BOOK ORDERING

Ottawa University Braves Fan Shop offers Verba Compare on its online bookstore. With Verba Compare you have the ability to compare other textbook vendor (i.e. Chegg, Amazon, etc.) prices against the Braves Fan Shop prices right on our website. You will be able to select the option that fits your needs, whether that is based on availability, price, or condition.

Don't forget that any books purchased from the Braves Fan Shop allow you to make easy returns, same-day pick-up and guaranteed accuracy.

TAKE A LOOK FOR YOURSELF

Go to the TEXTBOOKS link in the menu on the left.

1. Select GET TEXTBOOKS
2. Select the term, department, course, and section for each course.
3. Repeat these steps as many times as you like to select books for multiple courses.

When ready, select "Begin Price Comparison." You will see the textbook title on the top left, along with the Braves Fan Shop pricing on the right. Beneath that pricing will be a list of alternate prices from other vendors.

You can then add the textbook, from a vendor of your choice, to your shopping cart. Regardless of which vendor you select, the items will appear in your cart. This allows you to complete the transaction, or continue shopping, without having to leave the OU Bookstore website.

ARE YOU INSURED?

We want to ensure that each student will be adequately covered for medical services and prescriptions. Your insurance must include nationwide coverage and cannot exclude intercollegiate sports.

Annually ALL new AND returning students will need to complete the health services link (<https://studentcenter.uhcsr.com/ottawaks>). Every student will need to enroll in or waive medical coverage for the 2019-20 academic year. Ottawa University is offering a medical policy if a student is currently non-insured or underinsured; fees do apply which may alter your financial packaging.

IMPORTANT:

- Students will NOT be allowed to participate in activities or athletic practices until this process is complete. Fall athletes arriving on campus early must have it completed by the day they arrive.
- Financial clearance status may be altered should you enroll in Ottawa University health coverage. You MUST contact Accounts Receivable in order to verify any changes that may occur to your financial packaging.
- If the process has not been completed prior to midnight on Saturday, August 31, you will be responsible for payment of the premium for the health coverage.

ALL ABOUT IMMUNIZATIONS:

Here are the guidelines for required vaccinations:

- All newly enrolled (or readmitted) students born on or after 1957 must show proof of two vaccinations for Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR).
- All newly enrolled students living in University housing must show proof of the meningitis vaccine (16 years of age and older) or a meningitis vaccine (prior to age 16) and a vaccine booster.
- International students and/or any student identified as high risk must have a tuberculosis (TB) skin test within three months prior to the start of courses or proof with a negative chest X-ray. Results from outside the United States cannot be accepted. Please be aware the student may be asked to complete subsequent screening and/or treatment and failure to do so will be considered a violation of this policy.

Submit all immunization records/exemption forms to the Office of Student Affairs, located in the Administration Building, Room 201. Questions and/or concerns about the immunization/insurance process can be directed to Sarah Sipple (sarah.sipple@ottawa.edu) in the Office of Student Affairs.
