



APPLIANCE POLICY

Only cooking appliances with self-contained heating units may be used in student rooms. Such appliances include automatic-shut off coffee makers, hot air popcorn poppers, microwave ovens (no more than 900 watts), etc. Appliances with an exposed element or that use oil are not permitted with the exception of a toaster. Only small appliances are allowed in residence halls.

Full-size or apartment-sized refrigerators, freezers, or similar items are prohibited. Refrigerators should not exceed 5.0 cubic feet. REFRIGERATOR DIMENSIONS: These dimensions meet the requirements for students wanting to house their refrigerators in the space provided in the kitchenette. Maximum Height: 33.5" Maximum Width: 19" Maximum Depth: 24"

WORK STUDY PROCESS

The University process for Student Work Study is as follows:

- ► Login to your MyOttawa Portal, under the Resources Tab there should be a link to "Student Work Study" or click the link below. www.ottawa.edu/WorkStudyResources
- ▶ Download your Student Eligibility Letter
- ► Visit www.ottawa.edu/WorkStudyJobs
- ▶ After finding the position of interest, you may apply and MUST include your Eligibility Letter.
- ▶ If selected, the manager will contact HR by issuing your SEA, (Student Employment Agreement). Once Financial Aid receives and approves it, HR will send to the student for acknowledgement.
- ▶ After onboarding is completed, you are required to provide your IDs for HR to complete your I-9 Employment Eligibility Form. You MUST have this completed prior to working and will not have access to your timecard until completed.

NOTE: You will NOT be eligible to begin work until you have finished the process above and have access to your timecard in Paycom.

ARE YOU FINANCIALLY CLEAR?

To be considered financially clear, it means all financial aid documents are completed and payment arrangements

have been finalized with the University.

For "IN SEASON" athletes or clubs, the financial clearance deadline is ALWAYS 2 weeks prior to arriving on campus for any team activity. For students who are arriving 2-5 days prior to the first day of classes, the financial clearance deadline is 2 weeks prior to the first day of the term.

For financial clearance for the student-athletes who are arriving early for their sport, any student in this group with a payment plan, the plan must be set up to have a payment PRIOR to the arrival date. Example—if the student is a football player and required to arrive on campus on July 30, the plan must be established as a 12- or 11-month plan and be current with the July 5 payment completed to be clear.

returning students COMPLETE THE FINANCIAL AID PROCESS

Do this NOW so you can enjoy the rest of your summer and avoid annoying emails and letters!

- Step 1: Make sure you are enrolled!
- Step 2: Complete your housing and meal plan forms. We cannot start your clearance process, until we know your housing and meal plan charges. Please remember with the new housing system, you must first be registered for Fall classes, before you can complete these forms. ALSO—be advised you will not be cleared to move in without completing your insurance and immunization forms!
- Step 3: Opt in or out of University health insurance every 16-week semester.
- Step 4: Ensure your financial aid paperwork is complete. If you have any questions, contact the Office of Financial Aid.
- Step 5: If you need assistance with financial aid AND/OR accounts receivable, students must call financial aid first (unless they have already completed all documents).
- Step7: Be financially cleared! In order to be financially cleared, you will need to have all your paperwork for financial aid completed AND be cleared by accounts receivable. If you are NOT financially cleared, you will NOT be allowed to start in the fall. Your enrollment will be deferred to fall II.

Please remember you will not be allowed to move into your residence halls, attend classes, or participate in a sport without being financially cleared. We look forward to seeing you this fall!

ARE YOU INSURED?

We want to ensure that each student will be adequately covered for medical services and prescriptions. Your insurance must include nationwide coverage and cannot exclude intercollegiate sports.

Bi-annually ALL new AND returning students will need to complete the health services insurance waiver/enrollment. Every student will need to enroll in or waive medical coverage for the 2025-26 academic year. Ottawa University is offering a medical policy if a student is currently non-insured or underinsured; fees do apply which may alter the student's financial arrangements. Cost for this insurance is \$2,092 for the academic year.

IMPORTANT:

- Students will NOT be allowed to participate in activities or athletic practices until this process is complete. Fall athletes arriving on campus early must have it completed by the day they arrive.
- Financial clearance status may be altered should you enroll in Ottawa University health coverage. You MUST contact Accounts Receivable in order to verify any changes that may occur to your financial packaging.
- If the process has not been completed prior to midnight on Friday, September 19, you will be responsible for payment of the premium for the health coverage.

ALL ABOUT IMMUNIZATIONS

Here are the guidelines for required vaccinations:

- All newly enrolled (or readmitted) students born on or after 1957 must show proof of two vaccinations for Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR).
- All newly enrolled students must show proof of the meningitis vaccine (16 years of age and older) or a meningitis vaccine (prior to age 16) and a
 vaccine booster.
- International students and/or any student identified as high risk must have a tuberculosis (TB) skin test within three months prior to the start of
 courses or proof with a negative chest X-ray. Please be aware the student may be asked to complete subsequent screening and/or treatment and
 failure to do so will be considered a violation of this policy.
- All newly enrolled students are highly encouraged to get the Covid-19 vaccine and booster, if applicable.

Submit all immunization records and exemption forms to the Office of Student Life, located in the Administration Building, Room 201. Questions and/or concerns about the immunization or insurance process can be directed to OUKSInsurance@ottawa.edu in the Office of Student Life.

With Verba Compare you have the ability to compare other textbook vendor (i.e. Chegg, Amazon, etc.) prices against the Braves Fan Shop prices right on our website. You will be able to select the option that fits your needs, whether that is based on availability, price, or condition.

Don't forget that any books from the Braves Fan Shop allow you to make easy returns, same-day pick-up and guaranteed accuracy, as well as allow you to use your Book Advance (ask instore for details).

TAKE A LOOK FOR YOURSELF

Go to the TEXTBOOKS link in the menu on the left.

- 1. Select GET TEXTBOOKS
- Select the term, department, course, and section for each course.
- Repeat these steps as many times as you like to select books for multiple courses.

*Only textbooks purchased from the Braves Fan Shop are eligible for a book advance and are guaranteed to be correct.

When ready, select "Begin Price Comparison." You will see the textbook title on the top left, along with the Braves Fan Shop pricing on the right. Beneath that pricing will be a list of alternate prices from other vendors.

You can then add the textbook, from a vendor of your choice, to your shopping cart. Regardless of which vendor you select, the items will appear in your cart. This allows you to complete the transaction, or continue shopping, without having to leave the Braves Fan Shop website.

you have mail

Your personal mailbox is located on the lower level of the Gangwish Library. The mail room ensures that all mail (letters and packages) is distributed daily, and allows you to retrieve your mail at any time during the building's hours of operation. A key will be issued to access your mailbox. Go to the Braves Fan Shop to pick up your mailbox key upon your arrival on campus.

Package delivery consists of you receiving an email notification for pick-up location and instructions. Some parcels will be placed in larger package mailboxes and a key will be placed in your personal mailbox. When retrieving your package, the corresponding key will remain in the door.

How do I use my Braves Card?

Your Braves Card has many functions, so it is important to NOT LOSE it. This important card is your key to campus. It is your:

- Student ID
- Dining Card (so you can eat in the Hetrick Bistro—it houses both Dining Dollars and Braves Cash)
- Access into your residence hall

In addition, it can be used for purchases on campus such as:

- Vending Machines
- A la carte Items in the Hetrick Bistro (houses both your Dining Dollars and Braves Cash)

The best part—you and your parent(s) both have the ability to add money onto your Braves Card by going to www.ottawa.edu/bravescard.

What are Dining Dollars?

These are funds (in correlation with your meal plans) that are automatically loaded on your Braves Card for use in the Gibson Student Center, Hetrick Bistro. Any unused funds are eliminated at the end of the academic year.

What is Braves Bucks?

This is the most flexible account on your Braves Card. These funds can be used in the Hetrick Bistro. Additional funds can easily be added to this account on your Braves Card in a variety of ways.

First, you may add funds online with no fees. Online transactions are performed at www.ottawa.edu/bravescard.

Second, your parents can go online and add funds through the same site. Your parents will need your email address in order to add funds to your account.
